# The sun shines on... basic rules

Sit on the floor in a circle. Someone (suggest a leader) starts in the middle and says "The sun shines on people who...." (choose an attribute from list below. If students have never played game before, do a few "conventional rounds" first – people who wear size 4 shoes / born in July etc etc).

All the people who share that attribute must swap places and the person from the middle must try to take one of their places, leaving a new person in the middle to say the next "The sun shines on.." thing.
