WORLD WAR ONE LESSON

STARTER ACTIVITY

(Instrumental music could be used during this exercise)

Pupils are to be stood in a neutral position, hands by sides, faces expressionless (they will create a range of different characters in this starter – none of which are to be like them – so they need to get rid of habits, holding sleeves, messing with hair, walking 'their' walk)

Walk around the space with a moderate pace, speed up, slow down, change direction, touch a wall, touch the floor, make eye-contact with someone briefly.

Walk around the space as if you have a big decision to make, Stop, find somewhere to think about this some more.

Get up from your seat as if you are a soldier — obey my commands..

ATTENTION! (They should be stood upright, rigid, saluting the teacher)

GET READY! AIM, FIRE! (They should mime taking a rifle from the holster and firing it across the

QUICK, TAKE SHELTER, WE ARE UNDER ATTACK! (They should find shelter and should be sustaining role as soldiers)

Using <u>slow motion</u> you are to take a hand-grenade and release the catch and throw it towards the enemy then take cover...GO!

Get up and walk around the space once more, remember no talking, no touching... Get into groups of 3 and create a freeze-frame of a mother waving goodbye to her children as they board a train to be evacuated to the country.

You have 30 seconds to construct this. (Count down from 10 secs and then shout FREEZE as the teacher inspects the still images – highlight good work and focused poses).

Walk around the space, you must get into a group with someone different this time. Get into groups of 4 and create a freeze-frame of a family eating a meal with rationed food.

Get into a group of 2 and create a freeze-frame of women working for the first time doing the jobs men had done before they went to war.

Get into a group of 6 and create a freeze-frame of world war one soldiers in the trenches
