


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July 3rd, 4th and 6th

Students perform 'Eco Dance'







To help educate the School and local community about plastic waste, the Eco Committee came up with an idea of students performing a dance around the theme of plastic. Thirty—three students rose to the challenge and with help from dance teacher, Miss Wainwright, they performed their 'Plastic Waste' themed dance on Peel Beach in front of an audience and watched by Minister for Department of Environment , Food and Agriculture, Mr Geoffrey Boot MHK. The dance was filmed and will be used in assemblies and uploaded on eco-school education platforms to highlight the problems of plastic waste to the environment.

Throughout the School, we have made efforts to reduce our use of plastic. This includes changing from plastic to metal cutlery and from one-use polystyrene plates to reusable plastic ones and paper plates. We have been collecting plastic bottles to be recycled with new bins placed around the School.
