Cycling

#BeStrong Day

Students from Key Stages 3 and 4 took part in the #BeStrong Day on Thursday 7th September. The aim of the day was to improve resilience and mental health awareness amongst the students. To help ensure that the day was successful, 35 professionals volunteered to give up their time to deliver 16 workshops. The sessions enabled the students to have informative, first hand experiences of challenges they may face and give them coping mechanisms to help deal with situations should they arise. Information on where to seek help and further advice was a key element in all workshops.

At QEII we want to create happy, positive young people who have coping mechanisms to deal with a variety of situations. Our students make up a large part of the community and for them to be able to cope with difficult situations will benefit not only themselves, but also us all.

Below are some comments from students:

- "The drug and alcohol session made me think more responsibly about my choices later in life."
