## Year 10 Work Experience

As part of the School curriculum a two-week work experience placement is being organised for every student in Year 10. This will run from **Monday 19<sup>th</sup> June until Friday 30<sup>th</sup> June.** 

This is an extremely valuable and exciting opportunity, designed to give each student a greater understanding of the world of work and the opportunity to work with adults other than teachers.

The most successful and meaningful placements are those that students have taken the initiative to arrange for themselves. Therefore, we encourage everyone to consider carefully their future career aspirations and then contact a suitable company to arrange a self-placement.

Should your son/daughter fail to secure a self-placement they are able to access a database of placement providers. Every attempt will be made to offer each student who uses the database a placement that matches his or her aspirations, however, no guarantee can be made that every first choice placement is available.

**\*\*Please note that students MUST check the database before contacting any employer to arrange a self-placement as a position may have already been offered.** 

This year's programme was launched to students on Wednesday 18<sup>th</sup> January and introduction letters and the Work Experience Guide were handed out during tutor time the following day.

## P E Department Sporting Success!

This year we have already seen a lot of sporting success at QEII across a wide range of sports. The students have shown enthusiasm and commitment in their approach to training and have been reaping the rewards as a result of this!

The Year 10 girls surpassed their own expectations by reaching the Island Schools Hockey final where they were beaten on penalty flicks after a 0-0 draw with King William's College. The girls had been beaten 6-1 in this fixture earlier in the season but an adjustment in their preparations, and a refreshed focus towards the sport, really showed what this group of girls is capable of. The Year 7 girls also gave a great account of themselves finishing second in the IOM Schools tournament, with Hollie Dawson being awarded player of the tournament.

One of the best days in the sports calendar is the Schools Cross Country Championships, which was held this year at Castle Rushen, and proved to be a fantastic and successful event for QEII High School. There were eight races altogether, with QEII finishing first in four of them! Rhys Owen and Lorna Spiers won the Intermediate Boys and Girls titles, and Corrin Leeming and Kate Cashin did the same in the Junior races. The overall category winners were worked out from an average time of all competitors in each category from each school and QEII were awarded the shields for both the Junior Boys and Junior Girls competitions.

Basketball has been a big influence on QEII sport over the last few months, with two of our three Basketball teams reaching the schools final. The juniors missed out but have shown a lot of promise, and both our Inters and Seniors reached the finals after beating all other schools and finishing the leagues undefeated. The finals week proved to be heartbreaking for QEII with both matches against Ballakermeen following a similar pattern. QEII looked in control throughout and took a lead into the final quarter in both age groups. A spirited fight back by Ballakermeen on both occasions saw them pick up the Intermediate title in extra time and the Senior title by three points. There were plenty of cheers and plenty of tears at the end of what were two of the best school sports finals that have ever been played on the Isle of Man! It was great to see how gripped everyone has been with the sport throughout this time and we can already see that this heartbreak has motivated the teams to work harder in preparation for next year's competition.

Other achievements included the IOM Swimming Championships, which saw us pick up a Bronze and a Silver medal in the Boys and Girls relay events, and on the rugby field the boys and the girls have been improving considerably. The introduction of Under 13 girls rugby has inspired a group of Year 8 girls to try a new sport. The girls have gone from never touching a rugby ball to coming third in an Island competition. This is something the girls should be very proud of and they have had lots of fun in the process. The boys have also been doing well and, as the term progressed, more boys appeared at training sessions and the performances started to improve. The boys are starting to realise that if you want to improve at anything you have to work for it so I have no doubt there will be a lot of further developments on the rugby field to come.

The term has had lots of success and has shown how much sporting potential there is at the School. To fulfil this potential students need to work hard and make a big effort to attend all School practices. We will be providing lots of extra-curricular opportunities in a wide variety of activities from now on and would like to see as many students as possible making the most of what is available to them at School. It has been a great start to the year and I very much look forward to lots of further successes in the future.
