Jasmine to represent the UK at iGeo 2020

Year 13 student, Jasmine Crellin, has been selected by the Geographical Association for the four-person team to represent the UK at the 17th International Geography Olympiad in Istanbul this August.

The Olympiad involves teams from more than 40 countries across the world, which come together to take part in a range of geographical activities and excursions and to share their culture and friendship. It contains three elements: a written response test, a multimedia test and a fieldwork test.

To be selected for the team, Jasmine entered a competition to answer a series of challenging analytical questions based on 'the conservation and management of the rainforest ecosystem', where her answers were highly commended.

Jasmine said, "I am so honoured to have been given this opportunity to compete against some of the best young geographers around the world. To me this is an achievement that words can't describe after having such an interest in Geography".




The annual 'Evening with the Sixth Form' will take place on Thursday 6th February

Year 7 and 8 Accelerated Reader Scheme

This is now our third year of implementing the Accelerated Reader scheme for our students in Years 7 and 8. At its heart, the Accelerated Reader scheme is simple – read a book, take a quiz, receive instant feedback. The scheme has been proven to increase student reading ages by, on average, 7 months over a 4 month period, with some students making 12 months progress over the same time!

As the Accelerated Reader scheme assesses <u>comprehension</u> and not <u>reading ability</u>, it is accessible by all students — both books and quizzes can be read to the individual student, and there are also a large number of short articles on a variety of subjects which can be read and quizzed on. Improvement in comprehension has a follow on effect throughout ALL the subjects and not just English.

The books in the School Library have been colour coded to relate to specific learning levels – ZPD (Zone of Proximal Development). Following their initial assessment at the start of the school year, students were issued with their own ZPDs. They are encouraged to choose books within that level – if they read below their minimum ZPD, they will not progress, and similarly, above their ZPD the book may be too hard and the student will likely not pass the quiz. The quizzes are not restricted to books available in our Library – there are at least 40,000 quizzes on the system with new ones being added daily! Students (parents/teachers) can check on https://www.arbookfind.co.uk/ to see if their own books are available and, if not, click on the 'Suggest Quizzes' link.

Students are rewarded with individual Certificates for passing their first quiz, for becoming Word Millionaires or indeed, Multi-word Millionaires! In addition, we have now implemented a further reward scheme in which students will receive not only a Certificate, but extra achievement points and a further prize when they complete 10 quizzes at 100%.

Year 10 Work Experience

As part of the School curriculum a two-week work experience placement is being organised for every student in Year 10. This will run from Monday 22nd June until Friday 3rd July.

This is an extremely valuable and exciting opportunity, designed to give each student a greater understanding of the world of work and the opportunity to work with adults other than teachers.

The most successful and meaningful placements are those that students have taken the initiative to arrange for themselves. Therefore, we encourage everyone to consider carefully their future career aspirations and then contact a suitable company to arrange a self-placement.

Should your son/daughter not manage to secure a self-placement, they are able to access a database of placement providers. Every attempt will be made to offer each student who uses the database a placement that matches his or her aspirations, however, no guarantee can be made that every first choice placement will be available.

**Please note that students MUST check the database before contacting any employer to arrange a self-placement as a position may have already been offered.

This year's programme was launched to students on Thursday 9th January and introduction letters and the Work Experience Guide were handed out during tutor time the following day.
