If your child is ill, please keep him/her at home until they are feeling better.


If necessary, seek medical advice and do not send your child back to School until symptoms have passed and/or any exclusion times have elapsed.

### QEII High School Equality and Diversity Mural

We have a fabulous new mural, designed and made by Art Teacher, Miss White, together with members of the Key Stage 3 Rainbow Club. It can be found on the wall outside the Dining Room.






The Progress Pride Flag was developed in 2018 by non-binary American artist and designer Daniel Quasar (who uses xe/xyr pronouns). Based on the iconic rainbow flag from 1978, the redesign celebrates the diversity of the LGBTQ community and calls for a more inclusive society. The flag was updated in 2021 to include the intersex community, represented by the purple circle on a yellow background.



The raised fist logo represents unity or solidarity, generally with oppressed peoples, often people of colour. The black fist is a logo generally associated with Black Nationalism, Black Pride, solidarity and socialism. The fist symbol was heavily used during the BLM protests in 2020.



The use of the infinity symbol came from the growing popularity of it in spectrum colours to promote Neurodiversity. The idea of endless possibilities and untapped potential resonate through this symbol, providing a simple and recognisable concept in one.



The Disability Pride Flag was created to encompass all disabilities and was designed by Ann Magill, member of the disability community. The black background represents the suffering of the disability community from violence and also serves as a colour of rebellion and protest.
