GCSE changes for September 2022

As many of you will be aware from recent articles in the local media, all Island secondary schools are moving to new specifications for GCSE Science and History, which are graded on a 9 to 1 scale.

Teaching for these new qualifications will begin for next school year's Year 10 in September (next year's Year 11 are unaffected). For information on these changes, please see the recent government press release which can be accessed here.

We are also pleased to report that for next year's Year 10 at QEII, we will be moving to a new English Literature GCSE which is offered by the EDUQAS exam board and is also graded 9 to 1. This new specification will allow more students to access GCSE English Literature through a variety of engaging and exciting set of texts. It will also allow more students to gain an extra GCSE in English alongside iGCSE English Language.

Similarly, Music GCSE will be moving to the WJEC specification from September, which will allow those who have opted to study it a broader selection of musical genres, and will allow students more opportunities to develop their composition and performance skills.

Some of our Year 10 and Year 12 Biology students took part in the British Biology Olympiad this term.

This was the first time that students from QEII have entered this prestigious International competition and our results were outstanding. Over 41,000 students from 550 schools worldwide took part in the competition this year. Some of our students achieved Silver and Bronze Awards which placed them in the top 25% of competitors worldwide.

All students who competed were awarded a certificate and free membership to the Royal Society of Biology, which includes subscription to their magazine (amongst other things). A huge well done to everyone who took part, you have done yourselves and the school proud!
