### Senior Games – Spring Term

Throughout the Spring Term there has continued to be an outdoor activity option for Senior Games.

January and February saw the conclusion of the rock climbing sessions, with 12 students opting to brave occasional cold hands to explore differing venues around the Island, ranging from high and exposed rock faces of the Chasms, to the 120ft cliff abseil in Maughold.

Several students opted to use climbing as part of their GCSE PE too, collecting video evidence together to show varying skills and techniques. All gained really good marks towards their overall GCSE.

March and April saw a set of paddlesport sessions, again run in conjunction with the team at the Venture Centre. Students had a go in a variety of crafts, gaining skills in canoes, kayaks and paddleboards. We had a trip up Sulby River and also a session on controlling beach landings in surf conditions to finish off.





# **Radon Survey in Manx Schools**

Please see information below regarding the radon survey currently taking place in school -

#### Dear Parents/Carers,

All schools on the Isle of Man will be tested for radon during the summer term to bring the Isle of Man in line with other parts of the British Isles.

The simple test will see a handful of plastic detectors placed in ground floor rooms and basements during the summer term before the data is analysed.

This test was last carried out in 1989 and no problems were found.

The action is part of the Government's legal obligation to limit people's exposure to radon and is being supported by the UK Health Security Agency. If you have any questions, this might help – link to FAQs

Your radon questions, answered.				
What is radon?	Radon is a naturally occurring radioactive gas, which is found - in some quantity - in all buildings. Exposure to high levels over a long period of time can lead to health issues.			
Why test schools?	Simply to check that no children or staff are being exposed to high levels of radon gas. A similar survey carried out in 1989 found no problems at that time.			
How does the test work?	A number of coaster sized plastic detectors will be placed in ground floor rooms and basements for three months, before the data is analysed.			
What happens if an issue is found?	If a problem is found it could necessitate some small scale remedial work.			
Why is it happening now?	DEFA has a legal obligation to take a series of actions to limit people's exposure to radon due to recently updated health and safety legislation.			
Are children at more risk than adults?	No. The general pattern is broadly similar to that in adults.			
What is the harm or risk from radon?	There is compelling evidence that long-term exposure to radon can increase the risk of lung cancer.

## Consultation - change to the school day

We are looking to make some changes to the school day from September 2023, in order to:

- Provide additional time at the end of the school day for students to engage in enrichment clubs;
- Provide time for more regular opportunities for staff to engage in Continued Professional Development after school, in order to promote a culture of learning, collaboration, evidence informed practice and innovation.

The proposed changes include starting the school day 10 minutes earlier, reducing tutor time by 5 minutes, and moving to a 50 minute lunch break. No lesson time will be affected by these changes.
