#### Isle of Man Wind Orchestra


We will be holding a joint concert on Friday 2<sup>nd</sup> February for the school Wind Band together with the Isle of Man Wind Orchestra.

### Team 'Clean'



## Enrichment offer for Spring Term



QEII Debate Club started in October 2023, open to all year groups, and meets on Thursdays, 12.45 – 13.15 in Room D22.

Aimed at those totally new to debating, who want to try their hand at arguing their case in a structured way, the club have so far tried alley and balloon debate formats on topics as varied as 'boxing is a violent sport and should be banned', which one item in your suitcase you would save in a shipwreck, 'parents should monitor their child's online activity' and 'the best Christmas movie is....'.



The Island's high schools are starting the Manx Inter-School Debate League on 7<sup>th</sup> February, and QEII hopes to field a team in each of the 6 rounds, debating a different high school team in each round. Teams of 3 from each school will participate, following the World Schools Style of debating, with speeches of 6 minutes per speaker and 3 minutes reply per team. Topics to be debated include assisted dying, AI companions, excessive use of planned obsolescence, and whether the strategy to increase the Island's population to 100,000 will be more detrimental than beneficial.

With around 10 regular members, new members are always welcome, and our hope is to field a different team at each debate competition so that as many students as possible have the opportunity to try this experience. Any students interested in debating should come along to Debate Club or contact Mrs Watkinson or Mr Snape in the English Department.

































### QEII High School Association News and Events
