About the unit:

The unit will begin with a series of focused practical tasks and Students will be given a selection of seeds and seed pods and will have to complete a series of objective studies in a range of different media. Specific workshops will be delivered by the teacher to ensure students have the skills necessary to complete the task. This introductory task will form the basis of the portfolio element of the unit and will act as a starting point for the extended project element of unit one. Students will negotiate as theme and work independently to develop a body of work that meets the assessment objectives. Example areas of study include; Plants/Trees, Natural Forms, Still Life, Protection, Decay, Inside/Outside, Found Objects and Geometric Forms Throughout the extended unit students will be asked to complete further focused practical tasks to support the portfolio element of the unit. Life Drawings completed at the IOM College will also support the portfolio element.

Materials & Equipment

Students will be expected to use a wide range of materials and equipment. They may make use of any readily available materials within the department but may be expected to provide more exotic materials such as specialist papers, wire, collage materials, etc.

What the unit covers, covered areas:

The unit covers all assessment objectives and will allow students to work in a full range of media and materials (both 2 and 3 dimensional). Students will be encouraged to use both traditional methods and new technologies in all areas of their work.

Visual Resources.

Students will make use books, magazines and journals available within the department and in the school library. They will be encouraged to use the IOM college library. The internet can be used where appropriate but should not be the sole source of material.

Their work will reflect a consistent/confident and highly developed ability to meet all of the assessment objectives.

About the unit:

Students will be handed the controlled paper on or as close to as possible, the 1st February. The focus of the investigation must be identified independently by the student and must lead to a finished outcome or a series of related finished outcomes.

The investigation should be a coherent, in-depth study that demonstrates the student's ability to construct and develop a sustained line of reasoning from an initial starting point to a final realisation.

The investigation must show clear development from initial intentions to the final outcome or outcomes. It must include evidence of the student's ability to research and develop ideas and relate their work in meaningful ways to relevant critical/contextual materials. The investigation must be informed by an aspect of contemporary or past practice of artists, photographers, designers or craftspeople.
