This is an introductory unit to working with clay.

Pupils will use the techniques of coil building and pinch pots to create figures and decorate with applied and incised techniques. This unit focuses on the proportions of the figure and surface decoration. The details will take the form of what the figures are wearing, carrying and any pattern that might be appropriate. All work will be influenced by both primary and secondary research. They will experiment with a variety of clay techniques including handling clay, applying and incising detail, using joining slip and manipulation i.e. twisting, tearing, rolling etc.

Unit 2

Content

Unit 1

This is an introductory unit to painting and the study of colour.

Students will address the formal elements of Art, Craft and Design including; colour, tone, texture, line, shape and form whilst being given the opportunity to work in a variety of media. They will consider methods of gathering primary and secondary source material. Students will be expected to experiment with the media and techniques introduced in this unit to produce a creative piece of work based on the work of Sarah Graham and the Hyper Realism movement..

Unit 3

This is an introductory unit to print making.

Students will be introduced to printmaking, exploring 'Celtic Art' as a starting point. They will study Archibald Knox and celtic art on the IOM .

Students will research and analysis of examples of Celtic art , including; jewellery, ceramics, gravestones, knot work and Zoomorphic animals . Students will be encouraged to use gathered primary and secondary research to create images through drawing and painting Based on development work they will design and produce a "Poly block" Intaglio plate which they will use to produce a series of final prints .
