Subject content:

What is Studied Over The Academic Year:

Year 9 students follow Keim 3 (Level 3) of our scheme of work having studied Keim 1 in Year 7 and Keim 2 in Year 8. However in Year 9 pupils also complete written and spoken coursework for the TCG (Manx GCSE equivalent) and sit the exams in the summer term.

Keim 3: Unnid 24: The conditional tense of *ve.*

Unnid 25: The conditional tense of jannoo.

Unnid 26: Lenition 1 with ro, dy, my, dty.

Unnid 27: The perfect tenses.

Unnid 28: The imperative mood.

Unnid 29: The prepositions jeh, fo and marish.

Unnid 30: Lenition 2 and genitive constructions.

How are the students assessed:

All students are assessed throughout the year in the four skill areas of listening, reading, writing and speaking through a mixture of formal and informal assessments at the end of each term.

What Skills Are Developed:

Throughout the Keim 3 course students will work on the key skills of listening, speaking, reading and writing, but the emphasis will be on using Manx as spoken means of communication. The students will practise past papers of the Teisht Chadjin Gailckagh (Manx GCSE equivalent) and develop their general exam skills in preparation for the final term assessments.

By studying Manx in Year 9 students will gain a knowledge of the language that is all around them in the placenames of the Island and gain insights into the culture of the different peoples of the Island throughout its history.
