# **Content - Big ideas**

Composition : Composing a short piece (2 mins) using key compositional techniques BIG question : How do you compose a GCSE level composition?

#### Learning outcomes - Students will:

- Review Sibelius and how to navigate key functions
- Look and note patterns and groupings.
- Learn key compositional techniques, including: sequencing, retrograde, cannon, fugue, inversion, modulation and transposition.
- Begin to learn and use irregular time signatures like 5/4 and 7/8
- Review appropriate instrumentation.
- Look at key songs and their construction e.g. Radiohead, Earth wind and fire, Billy Joel and Queen.
- Create a 2 min composition.
- Add appropriate ornamentations and embellishments.

#### Assessment:

- Students will upload their compositions to google classroom via pdf and mp3.
- Students will receive constructive feedback on what they could or could of improved.

#### Theory : Looking at how music is constructed and how we can analyse a verity of genres.

BIG question: how do composers construct songs and how can we understand and analyse those techniques to write are own?

#### Learning outcomes - Students will:

- Review basic theory e.g notes on the staff, clefs, time signatures, tempo etc.
- Learn the circle of 5ths to better understand how to modulate in music.
- Learn Note intervals
- Discover Advanced scales including, double harmonic minor, whole tone etc.
- Review and use Modes of the scale.
- Analyse Key signatures
- Learn how to guess the time signature and key of a piece.
- Learn how to construct, locate and apply more complex chords e.g. dominant 7ths, inversions, extension and suspensions

#### Assessment:

Students will be given a mock GCSE paper to complete.

#### Performance: practicing to become more efficient at your instrument of choice.

BIG question: how can I practice to better improve my physical understanding of how music is constructed and performed. Learning outcomes - Students will:

- Practice a piece of their choice on an instrument they can play to a high level
- Discuss areas of improvement with tutor and teacher to improve the performance quality
- Take on self directed study and work to improve the piece.
- Research the history behind their performance piece.

#### Assessment:

• Students will be asked to record and upload a video of them performing to google classrooms to be reviewed.

## **Prior learning**

Students will be building on their key foundation of musical theory; they will then use that to help them progress in their knowledge of the subject and also apply it to a composition, the students will be revisiting Sibelius and using their knowledge of the software from year 9

### Global/IOM/Subject Links

#### Links to other subjects

Media studies – analysing how films and music work together to create an atmosphere or symbolism.

## Subject specific skills development

Scales- students will figure out how to read and decipher advanced scales including the double harmonic minor, pentatonic, blues and whole tone scales

Circle of 5ths – students will be learning about the circle of 5ths and how it can be used to assist with both musical analysis and also compositional modulation.

Ornamentation - students will learn different musical ornaments and embellishments including turns, mordents, trills and slurs to improve the quality of their compositions.

Modes – students will learn and develop a knowledge of musical modes within a major scale
